<p>Evaluation/ Outcome Data <i>(Actual program data achieved during reporting time period)</i></p>	<p>Results Achieved</p> <p>Out of 371 Youth Enrolled:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 252 (68%) of the youth successfully completed treatment. 2. Statistically significant improvement in mental health functioning & problem severity scores was achieved across the entire sample at 3 months, 6 months, and discharge administrations compared to intake. 3. 87% of caregivers were satisfied with the services their child received through BHJJ and 94% agreed that the services received were culturally and ethnically sensitive. 4. Statistically significant improvement in trauma symptoms was achieved across the entire sample between intake and discharge for Anxiety, Depression, Anger, Posttraumatic Stress, Dissociation, and Sexual Concerns across the sample. 5. 260 youth (70%) demonstrated reduction in substance use. 6. One year after termination, only 24 (9.5%) of successful treatment completers had a new felony charge. 7. (74%) of the youth (274) were suspended or expelled from school in the year prior to their enrollment. At termination, 77.8% youth were attending school and 62.1% of youth were attending school more than they were before starting treatment. 8. At intake, 36.6% of youth earned mostly A's, B's, or C's while at termination, 57.4% of youth earned mostly A's, B's, or C's. 9. Youth demonstrated a 70% reduction in the risk for out of home placement at the time of termination. Only 7% (17) of successful completers were still at risk for out of home placement at termination.
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
