ADAMHS BOARD ANNOUNCES FREE ONLINE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SCREENINGS

CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO – The Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) Board of Cuyahoga County announces free online behavioral health screenings on its Web site www.adamhsc.org, for the following behavioral health issues:

- Alcohol Addiction
- Depression
- Bipolar Disorder
- Eating Disorders
- General Anxiety Disorder
- Posttraumatic Stress Disorder
- Brief Screen for Adolescent Depression

“We are offering these free online screenings as an educational opportunity to help people identify if their feelings, or those of someone they know, are actually signs of a behavioral health issue,” explained William M. Denihan, Chief Executive Officer of the ADAMHS Board.

The screenings are anonymous and are not intended to be a diagnosis. The results do not replace a formal evaluation, but indicate if a person may benefit from professional consultation and services.

After a person completes the screening, results will instantly indicate if a person shows signs or symptoms of a disorder. Recommendations and available resources will also be shown. The results may be printed for follow-up with a behavioral health expert or primary physician.

The Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) Board of Cuyahoga County is responsible for the planning, funding and monitoring of public mental health and alcohol and other drug addiction services delivered to the residents of Cuyahoga County. The ADAMHS Board does not provide services directly to consumers and clients, but contracts with provider agencies to deliver services that assist consumers and clients on the road to recovery.
