6. CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

- Opiate Crisis The bad news on this front is that our County is continuing to experience spiraling increases in the number of opiate deaths. Recent reports indicate that fentanyl is now being added to crack cocaine and marijuana. Three major Cleveland television networks are planning to feature a continuous discussion about the heroin epidemic. The campaign also organized a phone bank staffed with experts to take calls from the community; a total of 157 phone calls were received. A lengthy discussion was held regarding the concept of stopping the flow of illegal drugs as well as the need for prevention and education for our youth, although statistics reveal that the ages of opiate deaths in our community are occurring for persons between the ages of 25 and 44.
- Addiction Recovery Advocacy Meetings The latest meeting was held on Monday, April 24th with nearly 150 individuals
 in attendance. Mr. Denihan obtained a list of recommendations from the group that speaks to the need for changes in
 our community.
- Mental Health Dedicated Levy Mr. Denihan reported that a proposal was made to County Council's President, Dan Brady, regarding the ADAMHS Board's interest in placing a Dedicated Behavioral Health Levy in November 2017. Rev. Gohlstin and Board staff's Executive Team also were present for the presentation.
- Dashboard Update The Dashboard document was shared with Board members for their information.
- Women's Homeless Shelter Mr. Denihan reported that he, along with Board Chair, Eugenia Cash, and Board Vice
 Chair, Robert Fowler, made an unannounced visit to the Norma Herr Women's Shelter Board to experience and observe
 the facility and its operations. The meal was found to be acceptable; however, the overall condition of the shelter was
 quite untidy; specific areas needed to be cleaned. Lockers would also help to organize belongings.

7. OLD/NEW BUSINESS

Nominating Committee Chair, Dr. Reginald Blue, reported that the Board composition is shrinking due to recent Board member resignations as a result of conflict of interest situations for Dr. Biegel and Dr. Romaniuk. The Nominating Committee is currently looking for individuals who are interested in serving on the Board. Board members and members of the public are encouraged to contact Ms. Krajewski with the names of perspective applicants. Ms. Thoms suggested using social media to relay this information to the community.
