<u>Welcome and Introductions</u>: Erin DiVincenzo and Jakolya Gordon called the meeting to order, welcomed the members in attendance, and requested individuals introduce themselves along with their agencies.

Agency Presentation ASIA Ohio: Samantha Salamon provided an overview of the health and social services offered by Asian Services in Action (ASIA):

- Immigration
- Legal
- Aging and Adult services
- Sliding scale health care
- Services are offered to citizens and refugees/undocumented
- Translation/interpretation services available in more than 50 languages
- Community engagement assisting the community with participation in the democratic process
- Services for survivors of sexual assault and human trafficking
- 95 percent of the services are offered at no cost

<u>Agency Presentation, PALS for Healing</u>: Misty Ramos Saivano, Executive Director, provided an interactive presentation to engage the meeting attendees as well as an overview of services offered to clients who have suffered trauma and/or loss and a presentation on Diversity and Racial Trauma:

- Racial trauma/Race-Based Traumatic Stress (RBTS) is not considered a mental health disorder (unlike PTSD)
- RBTS is a mental injury that can occur as the result of living within a racist system
 - Causes can be direct, vicarious and intergenerational
- Symptoms can include:
 - o Isolation, avoidance, reduced self-esteem, chronic stress, re-experiencing distressing events
- Some Ways to help heal:
 - Self-care/cope with stress
 - o Roleplay negative encounters with a trusted friend/colleague
 - Recognize your personal limits

Agency Updates:
