Messages of Hope, Recovery and Resiliency are Essential During this Challenging Time

In mid-July, the **Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)** reported that in 2020 the U.S. saw the highest number of overdose deaths ever reported. It was a 30% increase from 2019. The opioid epidemic has been exacerbated by the pandemic, which is evidenced by the drastic increase nationally in overdose deaths. Cuyahoga County saw this increase in late 2020 and we are still seeing it in 2021.

"These deaths are not statistics, these are our family and community members. We mourn with our community and it is heartbreaking to lose these meaningful and valuable lives," said **Scott S. Osiecki**, ADAMHS Board CEO, in a **cleveland.com** story about the increase in deaths.

"The ADAMHS Board will not let up on its efforts to ensure that harm reduction, treatment and recovery support services are available to all in Cuyahoga County. Through community partnerships, we have increased access to detox, residential treatment and medication assisted treatment. We have expanded peer support programs, recovery housing and harm reduction efforts such as Narcan/NaloxBox and fentanyl test strips distribution."

ADAMHS Board of Director In-person Meetings Resumed in July

The HB 404 extension, which allowed for public bodies to convene virtually, ended on June 30, 2021. Therefore, our Board of Director Meetings began inperson on July 7, 2021.

The Governor has signed the biennial budget, which at one point contained a provision that would eliminate the required categorical appointments and change the number of members appointed to ADAMHS Boards across the state. First Cuyahoga County Diversion Board Meeting Held on July 22, 2021

Scott S. Osiecki, ADAMHS Board CEO, gave an update on the <u>Cuyahoga County Diversion Center</u> at the first Cuyahoga County Diversion Board meeting on July 22, 2021. Also at the meeting, **Dr. Akram Boutros**, President and CEO of **The MetroHealth System**, was elected chair of the Diversion Board and the bylaws were set and approved.

Addiction Recovery Advocacy Meetings to Reconvene

The ADAMHS Board's Addiction Recovery Advocacy Meetings are set to reconvene on Monday, September 13 from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. on Zoom. This meeting will



include updates on several initiatives, including the Cuyahoga County Diversion Center and NaloxBox program, as well as a discussion of how the group would like to continue its work. Click here for more information and to view the full agenda

These meetings bring together family members who have lost a loved one to addiction, individuals with a loved one struggling with addiction, recovery advocates, professionals, and family support groups to unite powerful voices and create change through action.

Board appointments, this provision was vetoed by the Governor.

The Ohio Department of **Mental Health and Addiction** Services (OhioMHAS) budget maintained and increased slightly for FY22 and FY23. During a briefing from **OhioMHAS Director Lori** Criss, she noted the following priority areas over the next two years: youth and young adult early intervention; continued focus on children, youth and families; enhanced focus on adults with serious mental illness; expanding crisis services; protecting community funding for a full continuum of prevention, treatment and recovery; empowering families and communities; addressing needs of criminal justiceinvolved Ohioans; sustaining regional psychiatric hospitals; and equitable system of care.

We will receive detailed budget allocations from OhioMHAS concerning funding to our Board.


