Dear Members of the ADAMHS Board of Cuyahoga County:

I am pleased to submit the Calendar Year 2018 funding recommendations as a proposal for your consideration during today's Committee of the Whole meeting.

This binder contains information that you will need to make an informed decision during our General Meeting on November 29, including a summary of the ADAMHS Board's entire operational budget and projected revenues. The Provider Information section is arranged in alphabetical order by provider name and details the recommended funding level, program descriptions and outcomes.

Although the Board's overall budget remains slightly over \$67 million, I believe that we are strained to continue to support individuals in need of mental health and addiction recovery services. This is particularly true for services that are not covered by insurance - especially in the midst of combating this opioid epidemic - i.e., crisis, detoxification, residential treatment, recovery and sober housing.

In preparing this budget, staff and I considered that the Cuyahoga County Executive has recommended that we receive \$39 million in funding from the Health & Human Services levies for Calendar Years 2018 & 2019. This is the same level of funding that the Board received in Calendar Years 2016 & 2017. We took into consideration the \$3.5 million in discretionary State funding for prevention, mental health and addiction treatment and recovery support services, which is \$5 million less than we were receiving four years ago, as well as the \$6.8 million in discretionary Federal grant funding.

With a challenge facing us, I am recommending that we enter into one-year contracts with provider agencies for Calendar Year 2018. I would also like to point out that not all of the programs funded in 2016 & 2017 – such as pilot, discontinued and underutilized programs - can be funded in 2018. These programs are highlighted in the attached documents. I have also reduced the Board's Administrative Budget by \$300,000 or 5.3%.

I thank you for your time and continued dedication and commitment to our community.
