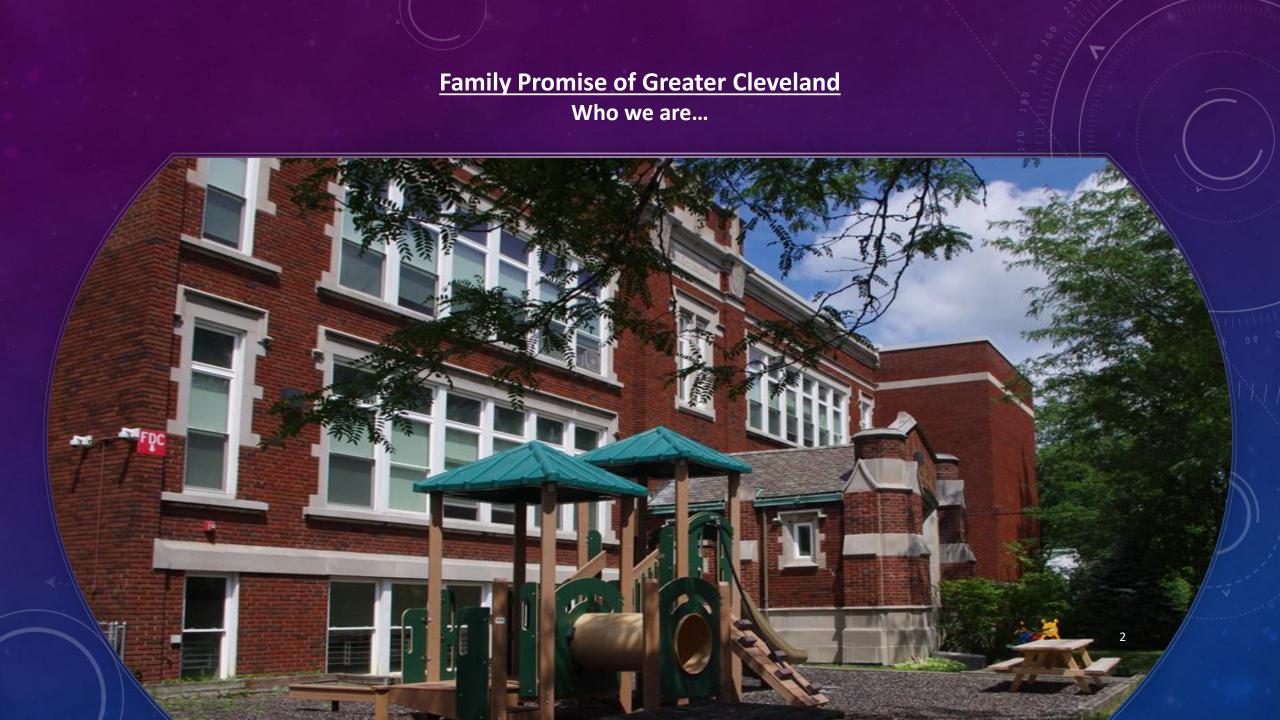


# Trauma-Informed Organizations

- New specialized focus on young homeless families
- Major shelter renovation 2016 2019
- New Strategic Plan approved mid-2020
- Change in leadership late 2020

#### CHOOSING A MODEL

- In 2020, FPGC released a new three-year strategic plan that specifically identified the importance of creating a trauma-informed culture as one of its three goals. FPGC explored several different models, but ultimately decided on working with the Sanctuary Institute (Sanctuary) because of the rigorous standards required to become a certified trauma-informed agency.
- Sanctuary is an evidence supported framework for creating a trauma-informed organizational culture.
- According to Sanctuary, the model is a blueprint for clinical and organization change, which at its core
  promotes safety and recovery from adversity through the active creation of a trauma-informed
  community.
- Sanctuary is a three-year implementation process
  - Year 1: Engaging
  - Year 2: Embedding
  - Year 3: Evaluating
- FPGC has just completed our first year toward this certification.

### When You Think of Trauma-Informed Care...

- Seeing clients through the lens of "what's happened to you" vs. "what's wrong with you"
- Understanding that trauma and adversity are universal experiences
- Focus is on clinical, evidenced based, interventions for clients



#### PARALLEL PROCESS

When two or more systems – whether these consist of individuals, groups, or organizations – have significant relationships with one another, they tend to develop similar affects, cognition, and behaviors, which are defined as parallel processes."

Kenwyn Smith et al., 1989

Popularized by Sandra Bloom, Sanctuary Model
