Responsibilities

Crisis Services in Cuyahoga County

- Cuyahoga County's Robust Crisis Continuum of Care in
 - MRSS, OhioRise, Mobile Crisis, Diversion Center, Crisis Stabilization Units, Psychiatric Emergency Services and more on the horizon (Care Response, Crisis Center, Orca House, etc.)
- Promotion of 988 for connection to crisis care

Using Grants to Increase Outreach

- 2023 SOR 2.0 Ohio Crisis Assistance and Training Grant
 - \$390,000 Designated to Crisis Outreach Team
 - \$25,000 Public Awareness Promotions of Crisis Outreach Team
 - Bus Shelters and Bus Ads, Radio, Digital, TV and Video.
- 2023 ADAMHS Funding
 - \$108,000 to NORA for Peer Staffing
- 2024 ADAMHS Board
 - \$600,392 Full funding

NORA's Crisis Outreach Team

- NORA operates the Crisis Intervention & Harm Reduction Program
 - 24-hour hotline
 - Community outreach Wednesday Saturday from 5pm until 1am.
- Community outreach consists of a multidisciplinary team including peer supporters, nursing staff and other behavioral health professionals
- Serves all zip codes in Cuyahoga County, with a focus on underserved areas.
- Provides behavioral health assessments, linkages & referrals, health screenings, behavioral health & harm reduction education, harm reduction supplies (including Narcan & Fentanyl Test Strips), and transportation to behavioral health providers.

First Eight Months - DATA

January 1, 2023 – August 31, 2023:

- Number of hotline calls received: 65
- Number of behavioral health assessments: 37
- Number of behavioral health referrals: 87
- Number of community outreach interactions: 3,014
- Number of Narcan kits distributed: 1,968
- Number of Fentanyl Test Strips distributed: 1,941
- Number of health screenings conducted: 132
- Number of referrals to hospitals for primary care: 51
